 - (a) *Acci* (line 1). Briefly identify this person.
 - (b) *aditus* (line 3)
 - (c) *Martis* (line 4)
 - (d) *armati* (line 6), *togati* (line 7). What does each modify? How does Cicero highlight the contrast?
