#### ► EXERCISE 4 ANSWERS

1. (future active infinitive) I believe that Fortune is going to snatch away riches and honors.
2. (future active infinitive) Fortune seems to be about to snatch away riches and honors.
3. (future active participle) Fortune, ready to give gifts and rewards, is loved by men.
4. (future active infinitive) Fortune seems on the point of giving gifts and rewards.
5. (future active infinitive) We do not believe that Fortune is going to give gifts and rewards.



#### TEACHING TIP

If additional practice on future participles and infinitives is needed, here are a few supplemental sentences of the same type as in Exercise 4.

6. Nihil ā mē in rotā Fortūnae dēscēnsūrō tenērī potest. (future active participle)  
Nothing can be held by me being about to go down (descend) on the wheel of Fortune.
7. Mē in rotā Fortūnae mox dēscēnsūrum esse sciō. (future active infinitive)  
I know that I am soon on the point of going down (descending) on the wheel of Fortune.
8. In rotā Fortūnae mox dēscēnsūrus esse videor. (future active infinitive)  
I seem to be about to descend soon on the wheel of Fortune.

1. Fortūna nihil mihi datūra esse vidētur.
2. Fortūnam numquam discessūram esse crēdimus.
3. Dīvitiās meās relictūrus/a sum.
4. Crēditis Fortūnam omnēs rēs externās semper possessūram esse.
5. Videorne tibi mox in rotā Fortūnae dēscēnsūrus/a esse?

If additional practice is needed, here are a few more sentences for translation.

6. I do not think that those men will have many things.  
Illōs hominēs multās rēs habitūrōs esse nōn putō.
7. I know for sure that Fortune will afterward take back those things given to you.  
Fortūnam illās rēs tibi datās postea receptūram esse prō certō sciō.
8. Fortune said that constancy would always be foreign to her.  
Fortūna cōstantiam semper ā sē aliēnam futūram esse dixit.
