The ruins of Carthage perched on the Byrsa Hill and overlooking the sea evoke Dido and Aeneas as well as the Punic empire. Carthage became the seat of the powerful empire, with which Rome waged three wars. While tradition contends that the Romans destroyed the city and sowed the soil with salt, the archaeology indicates that the destruction was not as great as the legend would lead us to believe.
