### ORAL EXERCISE 2

*This exercise may be used anytime after the use of volō, nōlō, and mālō has been presented.*

The teacher should use the preferred CPO to show a group of verbs and phrases (all the verbs should be in the infinitive form) describing various actions. The instructor should then ask students or groups of students questions that imitate the following pattern.

Visne ambulāre?

The student answers:

Volō ambulāre/Nōlō ambulāre.

In the latter case, the teacher asks:

Quid facere māvīs?

And the student answers:

Mālō dormīre.

The same could be directed to the group of students and done in plural:

Vultisne ambulāre?

Volumus ambulāre/Nolumus ambulāre.

Quid facere māvultis?

Mālumus dormīre.

Verbs and phrases with verbs: ambulare, dormire, librum legere, librōs negligere, carmina audire, ab aliis audiri, comedere, cibis egere, discēdere, manere, scribere epistulam, accipere epistulam, magnam domum possidere, casam possidere.

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
